



#### Why use an online tool for reporting?








Hero has a number of advantages for parents over traditional paper reports including:

- A 'live" system enabling real time updates for parents
- Reporting can include a range of media e.g. photos, video, links to google docs.
- Parents and students can contribute
- Reports can be downloaded and printed if required
- Accessible phone app or computer

#### Hero Hacks






- Choose how to receive notifications

- Red dot alert for new notifications




#### Understanding your child's report





At the top of each page is link to important information to help you understand your child's report.















Our School Expectations in Reading, Writing and Maths are based on the New Zealand Curriculum levels.

#### Reading, Writing and Maths






The current school expectation for your child.


Teachers add a comment on these pages mid (for those students working towards SE) and end of each year (for all students).



The Key Competencies in the NZ Curriculum are those skills your child needs to become a successful lifelong learner.


At Halswell School we encourage students to develop the Key Competencies through our School Values:




